
Here are some highlights from the first quarter of 2016:

GENDER-BASED PROGRAMMING | Prioritizing services for women and children as the most effective means to strengthening entire communities.

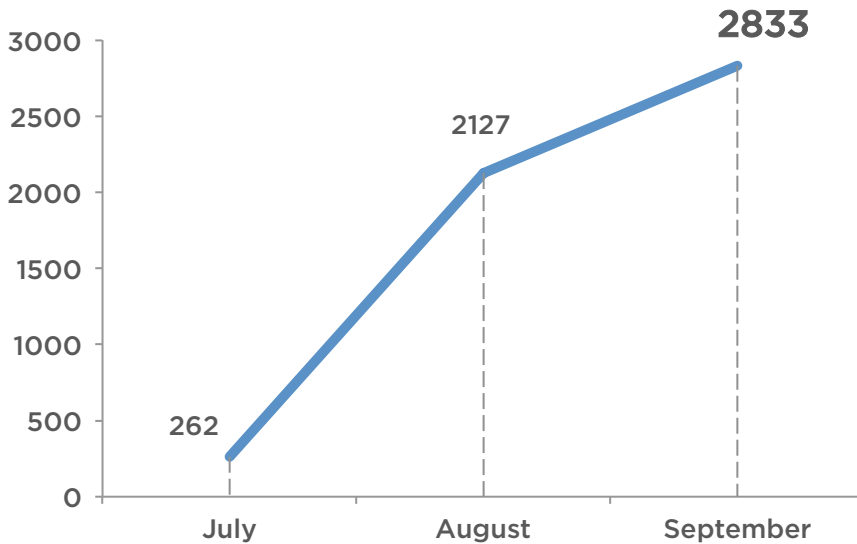
EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE | Implementing medical and public health interventions through decision-making based on the best available evidence and information.

SELECTED INDICATORS

Hope Through Health employs a dynamic Monitoring, Evaluation, and Quality improvement dashboard, designed to enable our team to easily analyze data and make program improvements in real time. Here is a selection of indicators from the first two months (August and September) of our new Maternal and Child Health Program. Data from July, prior to program launch, is presented for comparison.

Number of Children Under 5 Treated



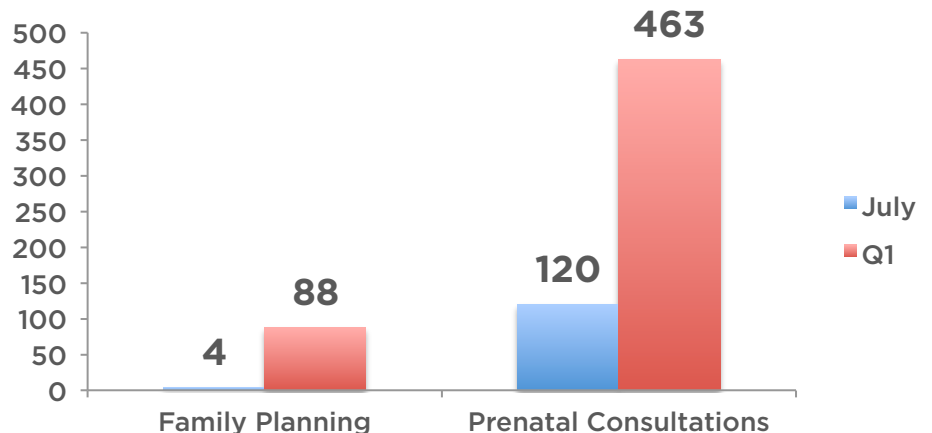
We saw a more than **10-fold increase** in the number of children treated either at a clinic or by a Community Health Worker.

Nearly half of all cases of illness in children under 5 were treated within **72 hours** of symptom onset.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH LAUNCH

Brigitte is 23 years old and lives in a small village with her parents and one year-old daughter, Julienne. Brigitte works as a tailor, making dresses and other clothing for women in her community. The first week in September, Brigitte's daughter Julienne fell ill. Brigitte carried Julienne to the home of Afi, the HTH community health worker in Brigitte's village. Afi consulted Julienne immediately. Afi treated what she could and sent Brigitte and Julienne to the health center to receive further care from the nurse. Within days Julienne was back to her healthy, energetic self.

Brigitte was very satisfied with Afi's work as well as with the health center staff. "Things aren't like they used to be," Brigitte said about her village since the Maternal and Child Health program started. "People are thinking differently about the health of their children".

Hope Through Health is proud to announce the official launch of our new Maternal and Child Health Program, which is working to strengthen care for mothers, like Brigitte, and their children by improving the delivery, management, and quality of maternal and child health services available at publicly operated clinics in northern Togo.

This exciting new program was announced by Chelsea Clinton onstage at the 2015 Annual Meeting of the Clinton Global Initiative on September 27th. Through this "Commitment to Action," Hope Through Health is expanding beyond HIV/AIDS to provide broader maternal and child health services in northern Togo.

This program builds directly on Hope Through Health's success delivering community-based HIV/AIDS care over the past ten years. The program is training Community Health Workers to deliver proactive screenings and services to women and children in their homes and providing mentoring and supplies to strengthen the staff and facilities of four public clinics serving an area of nearly 30,000 people. With this integrated approach, Hope Through Health plans to dramatically reduce preventable deaths among more than 5,000 women and children over the next three years.

In preparation for the launch of the new Maternal and Child Health Program, Hope Through Health's team in Togo conducted more than 150 community meetings and an extensive baseline household survey. "Securing the buy-in and trust of all of our partners – and most importantly, the families we aim to serve – is critical to this program's success" said Hope Through Health co-founder Dr. Kevin Fiori.

This project is being implemented in partnership with the Togolese Ministry of Health and is supported by funding partners including, Segal Family Foundation, T&J Meyer Family Foundation, Dining for Women and Direct Relief, with technical assistance from Muso, Last Mile Health, Partners in Health, the Department of Family and Social Medicine at Albert Einstein School of Medicine and the Department of Pediatrics at the Children's Hospital at Montefiore.

In just the short time since the Maternal and Child Health Program launched, Hope Through Health is already seeing an impact. As reflected in the impact statistics on page 4, the number of children receiving care rose by more than ten-fold in the program's first two months. Community Health Workers and clinic staff are making a difference in their communities by improving the health of mothers like Brigitte and their young children.



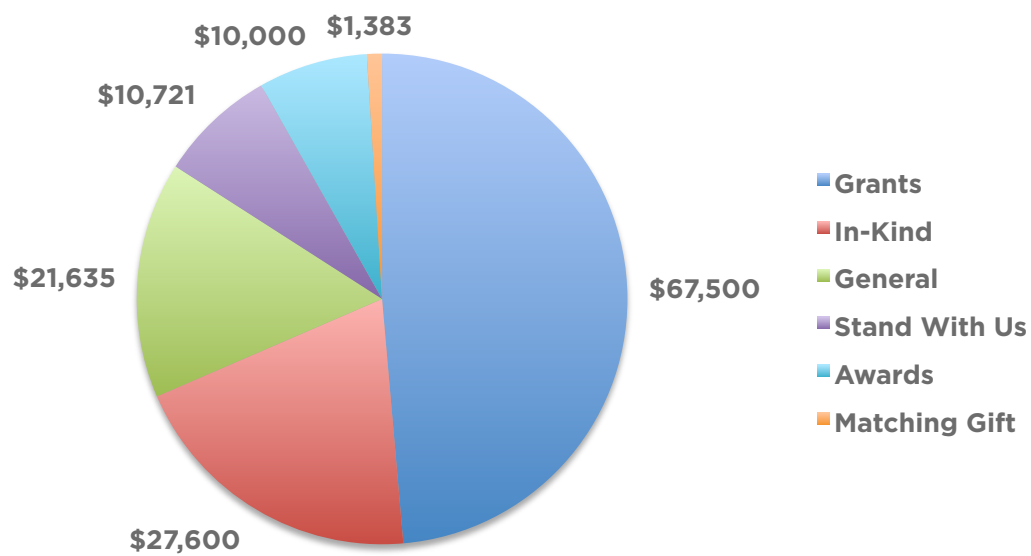
