Dear Friends,


This quarter marked the completion of the eleventh month of Hope Through Health's new Maternal and Child Health program. As we near the end of this program's first year, we continue to see strong results. As highlighted on page 4, this program is transforming the way healthcare is delivered in communities across northern Togo and changing the lives of women and children. Hope Through Health's HIV Care program also continues to demonstrate impressive results in providing high quality care to patients living with HIV/AIDS in northern Togo. We are pleased to share further details on the progress that we are making together, through this quarterly report.

Here are some highlights from the past three months:

- In April 2016, **Hope Through Health held its first annual All-Staff Retreat in Kara, Togo**, bringing together more than 100 staff members from nine sites across northern Togo for a day long workshop. This retreat focused on reinforcing organizational values and strengthening the organization's work environment. This retreat was an important step in Hope Through Health's development and an inspiring and motivating experience for all participants.
- In May 2016, **solar electricity was installed in the Kpindi health clinic**, one of the facilities supported by Hope Through Health's Maternal and Child Health program. This facility was the recipient of a Solar Suitcase, generously donated by the organization We Care Solar. Read more about this exciting development on page 5.
- In June 2016, **the first meeting of Hope Through Health's Togo-based advisory council** was held. Organized by Director of Partnerships, Andrew Lopez, twelve people were present, including representatives from the Togolese Ministry of Health, the United Nations Development Programme, UNICEF, the Global Fund and the U.S. Embassy. The advisory council will continue to meet on a quarterly basis to inform strategy to strengthen Togo's national health system.

We would not have been able to expand our impact and achieve these impressive results without your unwavering support. We are deeply grateful for your partnership, which has allowed us to move ever closer to our vision of high quality healthcare for all in the underserved nation of Togo. GENDER-BASED PROGRAMMING | Prioritizing services for women and children as the most effective means to strengthening entire communities.

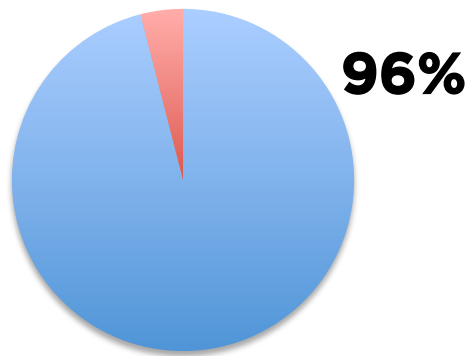
EVIDENCE - BASED PRACTICE | Implementing medical and public health interventions through decision making based on the best available evidence and information.

SELECTED INDICATORS

Hope Through Health employs a Monitoring, Evaluation, and Quality improvement dashboard, designed to enable our team to easily analyze data and make program improvements in real time. Hope Through Health also conducts an annual household survey, which allows us to estimate population size and analyze impact in terms of population coverage. As a result our coverage rates may change from year to year as population estimates change. Here is a selection of indicators for the first eleven months (August-June) of our new Maternal and Child Health Program highlighting our core impact areas of access, timeliness and quality. This data reflects population estimates collected in June 2016.

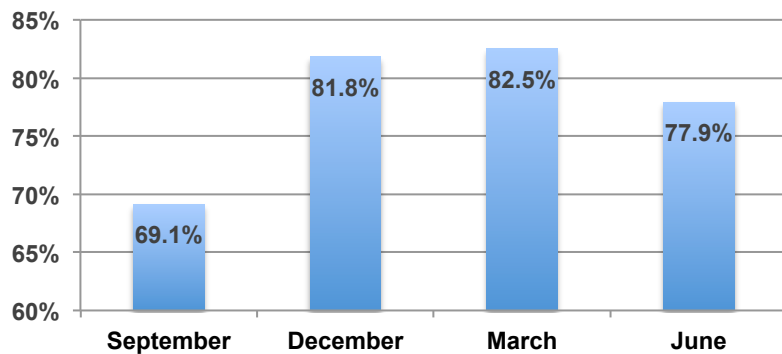
Percent of Children Under Five Receiving Care



Access: In the first eleven months of the Maternal and Child Health Program, **6,533 children** out of an estimated area of **6,727 children** were treated by Community Health Workers and at public clinics.

Timeliness: In June 2016, **77.9%** of cases were treated within the first 72 hours following symptom onset.

Quality: In June 2016, Community Health Worker adherence to clinical protocols was measured at **96%** through direct observation by a supervisor.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: KPINDI CLINIC POWERED BY SOLAR SUITCASE

The Kpindi Clinic is a public health center that serves a population of almost 6,000 in rural, northern Togo. The community relies on the health center for all basic health services, and until quite recently there was no form of power at the clinic. In 2015 a German NGO installed solar panels to run a refrigerator for the cold chain needed for life saving vaccines.

However, the center has continued to suffer with childbirths and emergency consultations taking place in the dark. May 20th was a historic moment for the community: a solar suitcase was installed that now provides light for the delivery and consultation rooms.

We Care Solar generously donated this innovative power source to Hope Through Health to support the Kpindi Clinic. Hope Through Health staff and local technicians installed the solar suitcase, and the technicians were impressed with the quality and comprehensiveness of the apparatus.

The technicians and the HTH team thoroughly explained how the suitcase works to ensure proper use. HTH's Clinical Mentor will visit to make sure that the suitcase continues to function well and is being used properly.

The Kpindi clinical team was extremely grateful and excited to receive the solar suitcase. They immediately began planning schedules for charging cell phones and discussing how many more tasks they could accomplish in the evening hours. They were sure that having electricity in the center would encourage the community to come to the clinic for checkups and deliveries. The solar technicians were also extremely impressed with the set up, and documented the installation of the solar suitcase to show their collaborators in the Ministry of Public Works. They plan to see if the solar suitcase can be used in other health centers across Togo.

Hope Through Health is deeply grateful to the team at We Care Solar for their generous donation of this solar suitcase, which is already improving healthcare services for the community of Kpindi in northern Togo.

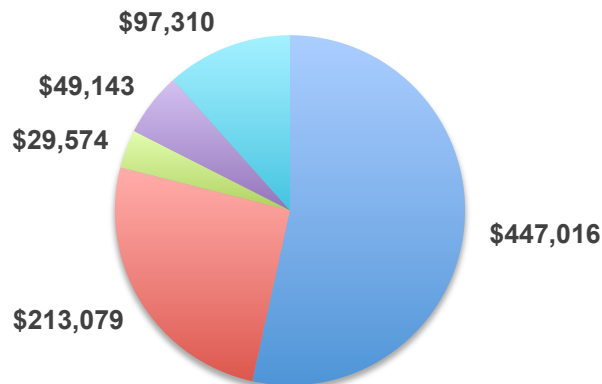
